Preference will be given to applicants who are active participants in the University Students' Council as a counselor, commissioner, committee member, or a writer for one of the campus newspapers (The Gazette or The Western News). However, students who have demonstrated a strong desire and willingness to get involved in student life will also be considered. Applications are available in the Office of the Registrar and must be submitted by January 31. Nominations for appropriate candidates are also encouraged. Lisa's friends and family established this award through Foundation Western as a tribute to her warmth, humour and breadth of character.

1. The applicant or nominee will be in Year 2, 3, or 4 in Arts and Humanities or Social Science. Academic standing will not be the prime consideration.

2. Applicants will provide a written submission answering the question, "Why do you think you should receive this award?" Submissions should not exceed approximately 700 words, will illustrate writing ability and could include any of the following interests:

- Outdoor activities, such as biking, canoeing, rollerblading, camp sports, exercise, etc.
- The arts- ballet, photography, theatre, music, dance, etc.
- travel

The submission will also include and describe:

- A) the applicant's involvement in resident or off-campus life (which could include commitments as a SOPH, residence council member, spirit team member or other voluntary involvement) ; and
- B) the active participation in the University Students' Council as a counselor, commissioner, committee member, or the writer for one of the campus newspapers. However, students who have demonstrated a strong desire and willingness to get involved in student life will also be considered.

3. Applications must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar, Western Student Services Building. **Application Deadline is January 31.**

4. Verification may be requested in reference to some criteria.

5. A committee consisting of a representative of the Undergraduate Scholarship & Awards Office, the USC, Alumni Relations & Development and a representative of the Gilmer family will perform the initial adjudication. Submissions from the top acceptable candidates will be given to the Gilmer family for final selection.

6. Recipients will be notified by Alumni Relations & Development of their selection for the award by March 31. Students in Year 4, who are graduating, will be asked to provide current contact information so that they can be reached in the fall when the award payment is made.
